Saving Babies and Mothers in Tanzania

Thanks to our caring supporters, Americares has been saving lives and improving health in Tanzania for more than 30 years. We provide ongoing support for hospitals and clinics, and have partnered on many projects, from health worker safety to infectious disease outbreak response.

One major focus of our efforts in Tanzania is maternal and child health care. Agnes and her newborn son are alive and well today because of our supporters' compassion and generosity.

Agnes, who has sickle cell disease, had been receiving prenatal care at Sengerema District Hospital, so when her water broke weeks before her due date, she immediately rushed to the hospital. Without the medicine and expert maternal care you helped provide, this mother and baby might not have survived.

Hurricane Helene Update: A Community Taps into Safe, Drinkable Water

When Hurricane Helene made landfall, communities faced devastating disruption to their lives—many were still without clean water weeks later. "Not having power and water was a big adjustment," says Jerome, a hurricane survivor with two children, ages 6 and 3, "It was a lot just to try to figure things out—the hand washing, food prep, bathing, cleaning and hygiene."

Thanks to donors like you, a timely response enabled survivors in Asheville, N.C., to access safe, drinkable water. Americares, with years

of experience responding to extreme weather, partnered with local organizations to install four AquaBlock filtration units, each providing up to 17,000 gallons of clean water daily for affected families in Buncombe County.

"It was a big relief," says Jerome, "especially for it to be within a mile and a half from our home." Jerome and other survivors could access clean water when it was needed most. Americares rapid action, our local partners and your donations made all the difference.

After more than a month of blood transfusions, antibiotics, and treatments to strengthen the baby's lungs in utero, Agnes gave birth eight weeks prematurely. Her son weighed just over three pounds, and was unable to breastfeed.

Midwives at the hospital instructed Agnes on expressing her breast milk. They taught her kangaroo care: a method of constant skin-toskin contact that keeps babies warm, prevents infection and helps newborns gain weight and begin to thrive.

Agnes is immensely grateful to Americares supporters like you. "I always get good treatment from the doctors and nurses here," she says. "I have also received counseling on family planning." Agnes is confident that the skills she has learned will help keep her family healthy.

For over 30 years, Americares Free Clinics have provided health care services to low-income and underinsured community members.

Maria is a patient at the Bob Macauley Americares Free Clinic of Norwalk in Connecticut. Maria was unable to afford health care for herself, and she had to stop working to care for her two grandchildren. Now, one of our health coaches at the clinic who is fluent in Maria's native Spanish helps Maria control her diabetes.

With her diabetes and hypertension now in healthy ranges, Maria credits Americares Free Clinics with showing her, "what to do and how to do it—everything from medicine to lifestyle changes.
